We are now in Lima, awaiting the birth of our second child, Joshua. We are all excited about the new addition to the family, and Sophie is getting ready to be a great big sister. Although the due date is still almost 2 weeks away, Sophia was born 2 weeks early, so Joshua could be born any day now. Once the baby is born we will have a good bit of paper work to do, not only for Joshua but also the (hopefully last) renewal of my residency visa. Once Rocío and Joshua are well recovered and in good health, we will be heading home to San Ramón.



Dear Praying Partners,

We greatly appreciate your prayer and support for our family and the ministry in Peru. It's been almost half a year since we moved out to San Ramon, and we are very thankful for what the Lord has allowed us to do and become involved in in this short amount of time. God has allowed for a very good and speedy integration into the ministry as well as in the community. The opportunities at both the school and the church have given us many open doors to reach out to the community and individual families in San Ramon.

Now that we have been in San Ramon for several months, we have learned first hand the needs and realities of the ministry in this part of Peru. Our vision for ministry is and has been to have a part in the training of leaders for the ministry here. This part of the Central Jungle is in great need of native church planters and pastors. Sadly, however, there is very little being done to fill this need. We are very thankful that the church in San Ramon is in the second year since it began Bible Institute classes. However because classes are held at night and during the week, the current range and impact is limited only to San Ramon.

Over the next few months, we will be planning and praying about the best way for this ministry to reach out to a much larger area that is in great need of the Gospel. Surrounding San Ramon and the other small cities of the Central Jungle are hundreds of small towns and villages, almost none of which have churches that are really preaching the Gospel. Two possibilities are either the establishment of a "full time/boarding" Bible school or a system of mobile, module-based Bible training. Please pray that God will give all of us involved in this decision the wisdom and discernment as to how to move forward into a long-term ministry plan.
